

Program Overview

In 2022, California launched the nation's largest children's development account program for higher education – The California Kids Investment and Development Savings Program (CalKIDS). The program's mission: support pathways toward higher education by awarding scholarships and offering savings to youth across California. The program is designed to create opportunities for families to prepare for and complete college, trade school, and career programs.

Administered by the ScholarShare Investment Board, and Chaired by State Treasurer Fiona Ma, CalKIDS takes the initiative by automatically awarding scholarships worth up to \$1,500 to eligible California public school students and up to \$175 for all children born in the state on or after July 1, 2022.



Mission Statement

CalKIDS was designed to expand access to higher education statewide by fostering college going mindsets and savings behaviors with California families through scholarship awards, ongoing education, partnerships, and ScholarShare 529.

By offering **quick and easy-to-claim scholarship accounts**, CalKIDS gives every one of these students a reason to believe in their path to higher education.

- ◆ CalKIDS aims to jumpstart college funds for millions of California families —eligible families are automatically enrolled in the program, and claiming a CalKIDS Scholarship is just a few clicks away at CalKIDS.org.
- ◆ CalKIDS Scholarships are more than financial assistance — **they're an investment** in students' futures, and we want to give every one of these students a reason to **believe in their path** to college or career training.
- ◆ A CalKIDS Scholarship can be used to cover qualified education expenses such as **tuition and fees**, required **books and supplies**, and **computer equipment**, helping to reduce financial barriers for families.
- ◆ CalKIDS is the largest child development account program in the nation, with over **5 million children** currently enrolled.





Program Facts, Stats & Impact

The CalKIDS Program helps to ensure children in California have a reason to believe they're bound for college or career training.



60% of California public school students in grades 2-12 are eligible to claim a CalKIDS Scholarship.

100% of children born in California on or after July 1, 2022, have a **CalKIDS Scholarship Account** waiting in their name.

College-aged students that graduated from a California high school after **July 1, 2022** may have a CalKIDS Scholarship Account waiting in their name.

Unlike many scholarships, CalKIDS **does not require** students to submit essays, meet a minimum GPA, or provide recommendation letters.

Eligible students can **claim their scholarship in just minutes**, making it the easiest step forward on the path to college or career training.

Studies show students with even minimal savings dedicated for higher education are **3x** more likely to attend college and **4x** more likely to graduate.

Eligibility, Award Amounts, Claim Process, Using Funds

Eligible children and students are automatically enrolled in CalKIDS. However, parents or students must claim their CalKIDS Scholarship Account online at CalKIDS.org to access the funds.

Eligibility and Award Amounts

Newborns & Young Children

► Eligibility:

All children born in California on or after July 1, 2022 have a CalKIDS Scholarship waiting in their name. There are no income restrictions, but parents must claim their child's CalKIDS Scholarship Account to access the funds.

► Scholarship Award Amounts:

All children born in California on or after July 1, 2022, can claim:

Up to \$100: Children born on or after July 1, 2023, have a CalKIDS Scholarship Account created in their name with an automatic scholarship of **\$100**. Children born between July 1, 2022, and June 30, 2023, have a scholarship of **\$25**.

+ \$25: Parents who claim their child's CalKIDS Scholarship Account on the CalKIDS online portal at CalKIDS.org will receive an additional one-time **\$25** contribution deposited into their child's account.

+ \$50: Parents who link their child's CalKIDS Scholarship Account to a ScholarShare 529 College Savings Account will receive an additional **\$50** contribution deposited into their child's CalKIDS Account.

= Up to \$175: For children born in California, that's up to **\$175** for their very first scholarship

Eligibility and Award Amounts

Students

► Eligibility:

Student eligibility is determined by the California Department of Education (CDE). To be considered for eligibility, a student must have been enrolled on Fall Census Day and must also be identified as an English learner or low-income by the Local Control Funding Formula.

There are two groups of California public school students who may be eligible to claim a CalKIDS Scholarship:

- Students enrolled in **grades 1-12** during the **2021-2022** academic year.
- Students enrolled in 1st grade during the **2022-2023** academic year and every school year after, with the ability to claim their account when they reach 2nd grade or later.

► Scholarship Award Amounts:

\$500: Eligible low-income or English Learner public school students will have a CalKIDS Scholarship Account created in their name with an initial scholarship of **\$500**.

+ \$500: Eligible students identified as foster youth will receive an additional one-time **\$500** contribution deposited into their account.

+ \$500: Eligible students identified as homeless will receive an additional one-time **\$500** contribution deposited into their account.

= Up to \$1,500: That's up to **\$1,500** in scholarship money for students!

The following information is needed to check eligibility:

Newborns & Young Children: The 13-digit Local Registration Number (LRN) found on the child's birth certificate.

Students: The 10-digit Statewide Student Identifier (SSID), a number that can be found on a student's school portal, transcript, report card, or by reaching out to their 1st through 12th grade school directly.





Claim Process

The following information is needed to claim a CalKIDS Scholarship Account:

Newborns & Young Children:

1. County where the child was born
2. Their birthdate
3. The 13-digit Local Registration Number (LRN) on the child's birth certificate OR the unique registration code on the notification letter mailed to the parent's home address.

Students:

1. County where the student attended school during the following academic year (based on the chart below)
2. Their birthdate
3. Their 10-digit Statewide Student Identifier (SSID), number which can be obtained by contacting the child's school OR the unique registration code on the notification letter mailed to the student's home.

Eligible Use of Funds

Funds are designated to meet a student's cost of attendance at their institution of higher education, which may include costs associated with the following:

- ◆ Tuition and Fees
- ◆ Required Books and Supplies
- ◆ Computer Equipment



Using CalKIDS Funds

Step 1: Log in to Your CalKIDS Scholarship Account

- ◆ Parents or students must log in at **CalKIDS.org** to access their account and request a distribution.

Step 2: Request Funds

- ◆ Students can request a distribution when enrolled in courses at the institution of higher education where the funds will be sent.
- ◆ Students must be at least **17 years old** to request a distribution.

Step 3: Funds Sent to Institution

- ◆ Funds are sent directly to the student's eligible higher education institution to cover tuition, books, and other qualified expenses.
- ◆ Program participants have until they reach **age 26** to use the funds in their CalKIDS Scholarship Account.

Linking CalKIDS Accounts to ScholarShare 529 Accounts

Parents can save independently in a ScholarShare 529 Account, California's official college savings plan.



Administered by the ScholarShare Investment Board, this program provides families with a valuable savings tool, offering diverse investment options, tax-deferred growth, and withdrawals that are free from state and federal taxes when used for qualified higher education expenses.

Parents can link their CalKIDS Scholarship Account to a new or existing ScholarShare 529 Account for additional savings opportunities, potential financial incentives and to view all balances in one place.



How to Link CalKIDS Scholarship Accounts with ScholarShare 529 Accounts

By linking a CalKIDS Scholarship Account with a new or existing **ScholarShare 529** Account, families can watch their college fund grow in one place.

ScholarShare 529 also makes it simple for friends and family to contribute to a child's education.

Linking accounts is quick and easy. Here's how...

1. Claim a CalKIDS Scholarship Account.
2. Open a **ScholarShare 529** Account (if there is no current account open).
3. Log in to CalKIDS and link accounts.

Frequently Asked Questions (FAQs)

How is CalKIDS funded?

CalKIDS is supported by state funds and can also accept private donations to expand its reach.

Who administers the CalKIDS Program?

CalKIDS is administered by the ScholarShare Investment Board, an agency of the State of California, and chaired by State Treasurer Fiona Ma.

Who is eligible for a CalKIDS Scholarship?

CalKIDS eligibility is determined based on two groups:

California-born Children: All children born in California on or after July 1, 2022, are automatically awarded a CalKIDS Scholarship. There are no income restrictions, but parents must claim their child's CalKIDS Scholarship Account to access the funds.

California Students: Certain public school students in grades 2-12 are eligible, as identified by the Local Control Funding Formula (LCFF). College aged-students who were in a public school in 2021 - 2022 may also be eligible.



Frequently Asked Questions (FAQs)

What is the Local Control Funding Formula (LCFF)?

The Local Control Funding Formula (LCFF) is California's school funding model designed to allocate resources based on student needs. It provides additional funding to support low-income students, English learners, and foster youth. State law requires the California Department of Education to use LCFF data reported by school districts to determine student eligibility for CalKIDS Scholarships.

How do families claim their CalKIDS Scholarship Accounts?

Families and students can visit CalKIDS.org and enter their Statewide Student Identifier (SSID) or Local Registration Number (LRN). Students can find their SSID by contacting their school. Parents of children born on or after July 1, 2022 can find the LRN on their child's birth certificate. They may also use the unique CalKIDS code from the notification letter they may have received.

How do students or parents find the Statewide Student Identifier (SSID) number?

The Statewide Student Identifier (SSID) is a unique 10-digit number assigned to students in California public schools. An SSID may be found on a student's K-12 school portal, transcript, report card, or by contacting their school directly.



Frequently Asked Questions (FAQs)

What can the CalKIDS Scholarship money be used for?

Funds are designated to meet a student's cost of attendance at their institution, which may include costs associated with tuition and fees, required books and supplies, and computer equipment.

Can CalKIDS Scholarship funds be used for schools outside of California?

Yes! Scholarship funds can be used at eligible higher education institutions across the country. Students and parents can use the Federal School Code Search Tool to check if a school qualifies.

Can scholarships be used for trade schools or vocational programs?

Yes! CalKIDS Scholarships can be used at eligible higher education institutions across the country, including community colleges, universities, vocational schools, and professional training programs. Students and parents can use the Federal School Code Search Tool to check if a school qualifies.

Is there a deadline to use your CalKIDS Scholarship?

Scholarships must be used before the participant turns 26.



Frequently Asked Questions (FAQs)

How many children are eligible?

Newborns & Young Children: As of June 30, 2025, more than 1 million children born in California are now eligible for the program.

Students: As of June 30, 2025, over 4 million public school students in California are eligible for the program, including those identified as foster youth or experiencing homelessness. This represents more than 60% of the public school population in California.

What is a ScholarShare 529 College Savings Account?

ScholarShare 529 is California's official college savings plan. Administered by the ScholarShare Investment Board, this program provides families with a valuable savings tool, offering a diverse set of low-cost investment options, tax-deferred growth, and withdrawals that are free from state and federal taxes when used for qualified higher education expenses.

Do families need to contribute money to CalKIDS Scholarship Accounts?

No, families cannot contribute money into their CalKIDS Scholarship Account, however, they can contribute to their child's college savings by opening a ScholarShare 529 Account. Contributions to ScholarShare 529 Accounts offer tax-deferred growth, and withdrawals are free from state and federal taxes when used for qualified higher education expenses.

Once enrolled in a higher education program, students can log into their CalKIDS Scholarship Account to request a distribution directly to their school to cover qualifying educational expenses.
